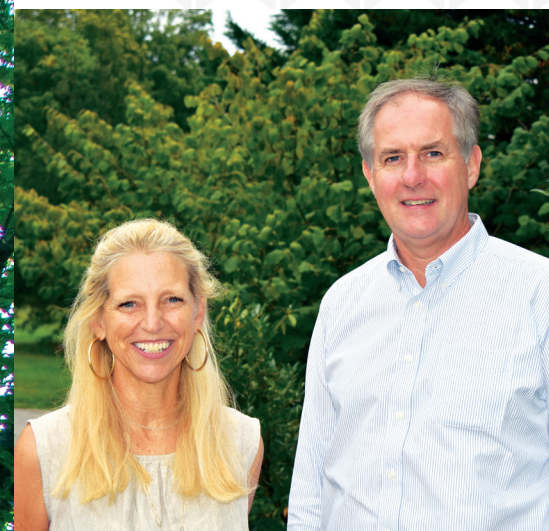

GREETINGS FRIENDS,

Fiscal year 2021 will not be soon forgotten! It began as the Arboretum gradually reopened from three months of closure due to the pandemic—tentatively at first with only a skeleton staff and limited visitors, no classes, events or indoor activities. Through the entirety of the year, many of our staff worked remotely while others braved the pandemic to keep the Arboretum open for a public desperate for sunshine, safety, and a bit of nature and normalcy during a tumultuous time. Although we limited daily attendance through the remainder of the year, we concluded 2021 with record attendance. It was truly gratifying to us and all the staff to be such a vital place of refuge and connection for our community when both were very scarce.

The end of the fiscal year also marked the successful end of our *Ever Green* capital campaign. Our heartfelt thanks to all who helped us reach our 36-million-dollar goal! The funds we raised helped grow our endowments to support critical new staff positions such as our chief arborist, as well as programs such as our underserved children's initiative, all while supplying significant support for preservation of our buildings, garden features, living collections and natural areas.

The Great Resignation that we are hearing so much about was more like the Great Retirement at Morris Arboretum. Several long-time staff decided that the time was right for their next adventures. We are very grateful for their service to our organization and are doing the utmost to ensure that the new members of our team build on their legacy. It will be exciting to see the ideas and energy this next generation of Arboretum staff will bring to our ever-evolving institution.

The year was certainly not without its challenges. Earned revenue was down for a second year in a row because rental events and educational programs were greatly curtailed due to the pandemic. However, thanks to your generosity, our Annual Fund and Membership programs ended the year ahead of projections. Thanks to new gifts and careful stewardship by the University's investment team, our endowments also grew significantly, contributing an additional \$568,000 in spendable income over the previous year. With reduced services and a temporary moratorium on capital projects, we were also able to significantly curtail expenses without laying off staff. This resulted in savings of over \$1.8 million over the previous fiscal year and a balanced operating budget.

On behalf of our staff, members, visitors, and community, thank you *very* much for your generosity and support this past year. With your help, the Arboretum is stronger and more relevant than ever!

PROJECT UPDATES

There were four major projects funded through the *Ever Green* Campaign that were completed in 2021. Like many of the Arboretum's projects throughout the Campaign period, the funds required were raised from many discrete gifts, both small and large, over a period of years. In many ways, these four projects represent the collective power of philanthropy to make compelling and lasting change.

Step Fountain Restoration

The largest and most complex project we undertook this year was the complete restoration of our magnificent Step Fountain. Constructed in 1915, the fountain's bluestone water steps had become severely cracked and chipped so that they no longer held water without regular waterproofing. Kreilick Restoration disassembled the steps and replaced them with new bluestone steps quarried in central Pennsylvania from the same stone as the originals. The water pumps and filtration as well as the cheek walls and some of the balustrades were also replaced. A new porous pathway and extensive plantings were installed by Morris staff to properly showcase the finished work. The project recently received a Preservation Recognition Award from the Chestnut Hill Conservancy.

Dorrance Hamilton Fernery Heating

The Dorrance Hamilton Fernery is the only remaining Victorian fernery in North America, granting it a spot on the National Register of Historic Places. It is truly a unique structure housing an irreplaceable collection of tropical ferns and fern allies. The warm, humid environment is perfect for ferns but not so great for the cast iron heating pipes that kept the glasshouse warm even on cold winter nights. During the summer of 2020, contractors removed all the old, rusted pipes and replaced them with stainless and powder-coated fin tubing. The finished product is both visually more appealing and far more energy efficient and effective.

Orange Balustrade Refurbishment

The Orange Balustrade pergola and benches as well as the underlying foundation required a complete rebuild to replace decayed boards and timbers. The structure was disassembled and new rot-resistant Ipe decking, western red cedar benches, and eastern red cedar posts were put in place.

Deer Fence

To prevent deer from continuing to become injured on the Arboretum's historic wrought iron fence, as well as to grow and protect the many plants at the Arboretum, we erected a new 11,000-foot-long metal deer fence enclosing about 75% of the Compton side of the Arboretum. This new fence allowed us to remove hundreds of wire circles that formerly ringed small trees and shrubs, and visitors this past spring were able to enjoy a beautiful display of tulips and other bulbs that would have been impossible without the fence due to deer grazing.

INVESTING IN ENDOWMENT

Growing the Arboretum’s Fiscal Strength

It has long been a truism that endowments are one of the most important elements in planning for a non-profit’s future. For many decades, the Morris Arboretum has carefully cultivated a culture of investment among its philanthropic strategies, with endowment growth representing one of the key indicators of financial stability and operational strength. It is no accident that over the past decade alone, the Arboretum has received endowment gifts totaling more than \$15 million, bringing total endowment assets in FY21 to more than \$84 million. While the principal of these endowments cannot be touched, interest earnings represent approximately one-third of our operating budget, ensuring that the Arboretum maintains the financial means to remain mission – focused and on sound footing even during transitional or challenging times.

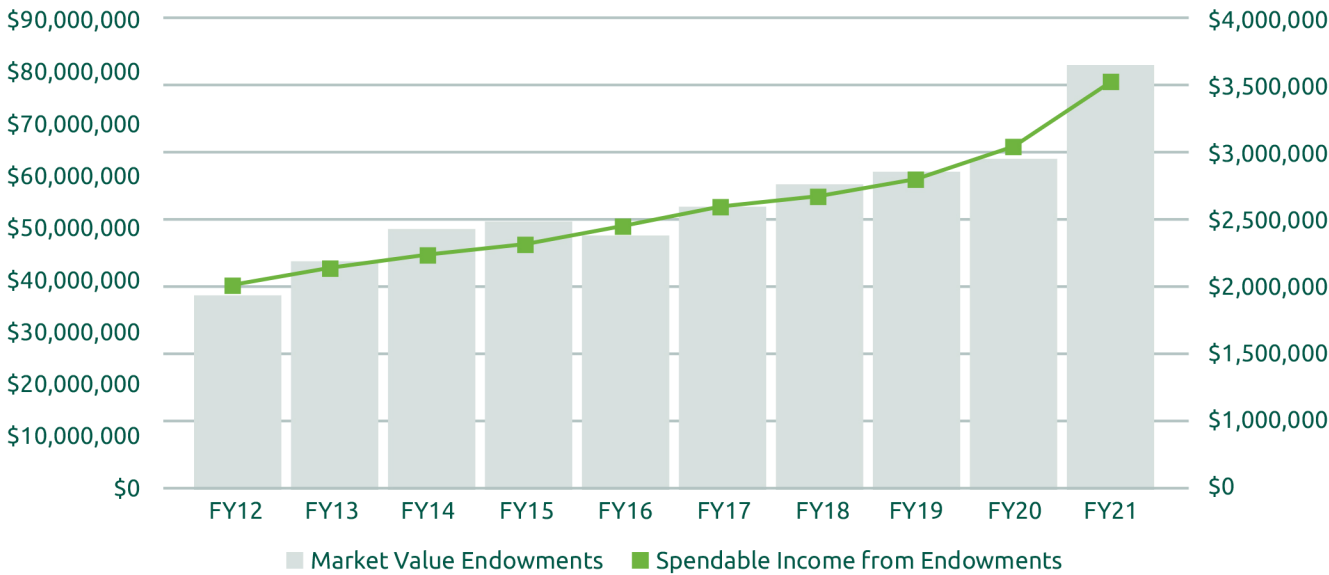

A CAMPAIGN CLOSES, A NEW ERA BEGINS

By June 30, 2021, the official ending date of the *Ever Green* Campaign — the Arboretum received contributions, gifts, and grants — from both private and public sources — surpassing the Campaign’s original \$36 million goal.

This total comprised an average of 5,325 unique contributions during each year of the public and quiet phases of the Campaign. These contributions captured the generous spirit of the Arboretum’s community who felt passionate about the Arboretum’s value and wished to support its mission and future progress in ways both large and small.

From the moment that the *Ever Green* Campaign was publicly launched in April 2018, it was nearly a foregone conclusion that the Campaign’s close would usher in a brand new era at the Morris Arboretum. The aims of the Campaign were clear:

- fortify the Arboretum’s financial stability;
- preserve and maintain historic garden features;
- restore and enhance iconic garden experiences and visitor amenities across the Arboretum; and
- elevate the Arboretum’s plant science research and conservation programs.

Arboretum members, donors, friends, and advocates gave swiftly and generously. Each year of the Campaign brought new resources to the Arboretum, created new positions, established new endowments, expanded programs, preserved iconic garden features, and generated new energy in all areas of the Arboretum’s operations.

But — like everything else in these times — the Campaign did not go exactly as planned.

With only a year and half left to close the Campaign, COVID-19 changed our world. Both too much and not enough has been said about the profound impact this pandemic has had on the past two years on both a national and global scale, but from the Arboretum’s small corner of the universe, surely what

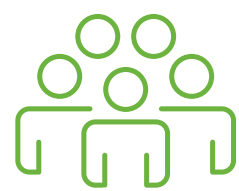
cannot be overstated is the depth of gratitude for our community’s ongoing support during the most tumultuous period in most of our memories.

Despite the uncertainty of the times, philanthropy at all levels was evident. In FY21 our membership program grew by leaps and bounds, the Annual Fund had a record-breaking year, and our donors continued to support key, priority projects at the Arboretum. Indeed, major gifts in FY21 supported the ongoing operations and endowment of the much beloved Garden Railway, strengthened the marketing endowment, initiated Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility consultations, expanded programs for underserved schoolchildren and youth groups, improved efforts to curate and tag the Arboretum’s large and diverse living collections, and helped to preserve, restore, and enhance accessibility at the Arboretum’s iconic Rose Garden.

In 2021, even among so many competing philanthropic demands, the Arboretum’s donors, members, and friends reaffirmed through their giving that the Arboretum remains a highly valued destination where family and friends can gather in healing green spaces, to safely reconnect with nature and with each other. FY21 was the year that confirmed that the Arboretum — and green spaces everywhere — are critical to our mental and physical health, help us to cope during difficult times, and provide us with respite from the churn of the modern world. These truisms will lead the way forward for the Arboretum, and it is with a renewed sense of hope, gratitude, and a focus on new beginnings that the Arboretum moves into a new era beyond *Ever Green*, but very much strengthened by its support.
