Frank Lloyd Wright said, "Study nature, love nature, stay close to nature. It will never fail you!"

Well, I've been lucky enough to study nature through the lens of the Morris Arboretum for most of my life and have watched it grow from a wild, beggingto-be-partly-tamed property in the 60s and 70s, to the worldwide recognized Arboretum that it is today.

In every season, the Morris Arboretum never ceases to amaze me. In fact, I dare anyone not to fall for the heady power of the ethereal pink magnolia slope in spring, be mesmerized by the cheeky kingfisher and sunbathing box turtles in the wetland, or not feel the sublime pull of summer while in the Rose Garden. As sections of the garden have morphed into their glory over the years, the Morris Arboretum's employees have done the same. And, I have been lucky enough as an Advisory Board member for the past 18+ years and Board Chair for six years to witness and work with its very talented F. Otto Haas executive directors—Paul Meyer, Bob Gutowski, and Bill Cullina.

For 43 years, Paul made his mark upon the Morris Arboretum and served as the executive director from 1991 to 2019. He left the institution with an international reputation and guaranteed the upkeep of many of the key features by securing endowments for future care. When Paul retired in March 2019, the reins were handed over to the most reliable and institutionally knowledgeable Bob Gutowski. During Bob's capable three-month interim leadership, we were able to focus on the search for the new director and know that not a beat would be missed with the day-to-day operations.

Through an extensive search that ran from winter 2018 to spring 2019—and with an amazing search committee, luck, and hard work—we found Bill Cullina. Bill hit the ground running, bringing with him a deep horticultural background plus the exceptional management experience of running and building Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens. Bill kept the Morris Arboretum afloat during the pandemic and he continues to keep a steady hand and creative eye on the operations while also working closely with the University of Pennsylvania. The Morris Arboretum is in good hands!

To have worked with each of these directors, the University of Pennsylvania, and our fabulous Advisory Board has been a most glorious honor.

DEAR FRIENDS,

On behalf of all of us here at the Morris Arboretum, please accept my sincerest thanks for your generous support this past year. Your contributions underwrite our children's education programs, bolster our plant collections and gardens, preserve our historic buildings and structures, sustain our conservation research, and support and nurture our wonderful staff.

Speaking of staff, this year was a momentous one. Thanks to the growth of our endowments and your generosity, we were able to lift the minimum wage to \$15 an hour while making significant adjustments to many of our hourly employees' salaries to avoid wage compression. We accomplished a major transformation of our formerly large temporary staff by creating 31 new fulland part-time positions that now provide those same staff with far greater benefits, more hours, better pay, and job security. Thanks to the health of our internship endowments, we were able to restructure the intern program to create five new positions: one in marketing, one additional in education and arboriculture, and two additional in horticulture.

Again, because of your generosity, we engaged consultants to undertake a major audience survey and a candid analysis of our progress toward greater diversity, equity, and inclusion. The results of these studies informed a rebranding effort aimed at introducing new audiences to the beauty of our Arboretum. It will be rolled out in the coming year along with a brand-new logo and website.

As a result of several significant gifts, we were able to enlist Reed Hilderbrand landscape architects and KieranTimberlake architects to craft a new 30-year master plan to guide us thoughtfully into the mid-century and beyond. The work kicked off in October and will also be unveiled next year.

It has often been said that the last two years have reignited an appreciation for the outdoors and nature in our collective consciousness. As an oasis of shade, safety, and serenity in the city, the Arboretum saw record visitation this past year, along with the welcome return of school groups, campers, class participants, and wedding attendees. For someone such as myself for whom public horticulture is a vocation, it was a tremendously rewarding year!

SEASONS OF GIVING

Above all else, the Morris Arboretum is invigorated, directed, and sometimes humbled by the seasons. For many, FY22 felt like a joyous emergence from a long, cold winter, and the Arboretum was an engaging central meeting point for friends and families to reconnect. Our membership program continued to grow, and our ongoing operations were generously supported by hundreds of donors who gave to our Annual Fund and operating programs.

Our youth outreach programs took on new significance as schools and community programs began to re-engage. Donors extended their altruism to the Education Endowment for Underserved Schoolchildren to enable the Arboretum to offer programming to greater numbers of schoolchildren through our Partners in Education (PINE) program. Our supporters also continued to reconfirm the lasting value of the *¡Explorar!* summer bridge program with gifts that enable the Arboretum to offer this admission-free program to middle school children from the ACLAMO Family Center every summer. Our School Outreach Coordinator, a brand-new donor-funded position, made great strides in connecting the Arboretum to public schools across northwest Philadelphia and beyond.

The gardens flourished more than ever before, as special gifts to our Ornamental Plant Endowment helped to ensure sufficient resources to purchase and care for all manner of plants that made the garden teem with vibrant color. Support for the ongoing care and restoration of the Rose Garden ensured that its quiet, dazzling elegance was enjoyed by scores of visitors all spring and summer long.

Special gifts this year also included funds for the establishment of an endowed Marketing Internship. This new position will help to support our Marketing Department in its efforts to promote the Morris Arboretum as one of the leading cultural attractions in the region and the nation. The Arboretum was equally grateful for a special challenge gift in support of the ultimate establishment of a new laboratory for the important work of the Arboretum's Plant Sciences research program.

As the seasons continue to turn, the support of our members, donors, and friends remains as valued as ever, and it is with gratitude that we warmly embrace our community as we celebrate the accomplishments of FY22 and look ahead to a promising future. The Arboretum's sights are firmly set on the new year with a sense of vigor and purpose. The completion of the new master plan will provide a blueprint for the Arboretum's future, and we look forward to communicating our plans as they emerge.

INVESTING IN ENDOWMENT Growing the Arboretum's Fiscal Strength

Although the Arboretum was able to reopen just before the start of the fiscal year, our education programs, rental events and other key earned revenue segments continued to be negatively impacted for the first three quarters of the year. Fortunately, thanks to expense reductions and the strength of our admissions, annual giving and endowments, we ended the year firmly in the black. The health, depth and breadth of our endowments is something we are deeply grateful for. Over the past decade, the Arboretum has received over \$15.1 million in endowment gifts, with total endowment assets totaling \$83.8 million at the end of the last fiscal year, FY22. While the principal of these investments may not be touched, interest on the endowments provides ongoing support for a large portion of the Arboretum's operations, with this income covering nearly 42 percent of operating expenses in FY22. Gifts to endowment and generated investment income provide a stable funding source that enables the Morris Arboretum to remain mission-focused regardless of external challenges.






