Greetings

In 2023, we celebrate our 90th year as a public garden. University of Pennsylvania President Thomas Sovereign Gates officially opened the Morris estate to the public in the spring of 1933 as the newly minted Morris Arboretum. Through the decades, the Morris has grown into one of the largest public gardens in the United States. We are proud to be an arboretum, but we, like many of our peers, realize that many people do not understand what an arboretum is. The truth is, along with our amazing collection of trees, we are also known for our gardens. So, in celebration of our 90th, we decided to expand our name to include both. It is our belief that by changing our name to Morris Arboretum & Gardens, we are more accurately describing who we are while making ourselves more understandable and welcoming to wider audiences.

Speaking of gardens, in April, we reopened our beloved and greatly enhanced Rose Garden, now featuring elegant Pennsylvania bluestone pathways on the central axes for greater accessibility and functionality. In May we celebrated the 25th anniversary of our Garden Railway with an expanded track system and extensive new plantings. In June we opened a brand new “pop-up” garden, *Exuberant Blooms*, which featured a quarter acre of bee- and bird-friendly blooms in a section of former turf within the Azalea Meadow, to the delight of visitors and butterflies alike.

Although trees often outlive us, they do not live forever. Many of the trees alive when President Gates cut the ribbon in 1933 are no longer with us. Age,

disease, and climate change have all played a part. One particularly sad loss this year was the large red oak that graced the corner of our property on Stenton Avenue that is the northwesternmost point in the city of Philadelphia. We replaced it with a sapling southern live oak collected on our 2012 expedition to the Tidewater Virginia area, which we hope will live to see our 300th anniversary. This year we sent our staff to Kentucky, Alabama, and locally here in Pennsylvania to collect native species we hope will be better climate-adapted to the future Morris. Additionally, staff planted over 200 trees and shrubs from our nursery on the grounds this fall.

As we near the dawn of our second century as a public garden, I am excited to report that we are putting the finishing touches on our comprehensive 20-year master site plan. The plan features greatly expanded research and education facilities, new and restored gardens and features, and key visitor amenities such as accessible parking and entry, a new food and event space, and much more.

As always, I am deeply grateful for your support for this wonderful institution. I hope you are as proud as I am at what we have become and as excited as I for the bright future ahead.

Ninety years have passed since the Morris Arboretum & Gardens opened its gates to a curious public. In 1933—at the height of the Great Depression—visitors flocked to see the exquisite gardens at the former estate of industrialist scions Lydia and John Morris. Carefully conceived and beautifully tended, the gardens were both iconic and inspiring. Beauty was in short supply and the Morris delivered it in spades.

Today, the Morris remains among the most beautiful public gardens in the region and the nation. Its living collection is admired by peer institutions around the world, and our visitors—more than 170,000 in FY23—still flock to experience the abundant beauty that is found at nearly every turn.

The Morris recognizes that its beauty is powerful—it opens a portal for welcoming the public and inspiring them to consider the many ways in which they can connect with nature. As is often said, the Morris is a living laboratory, where plant science, horticulture, education, and outreach initiatives join forces to convey and share important information about the natural world.

Our donors enthusiastically and generously support these efforts. In 2023, the Morris received more than 5,800 gifts totaling nearly \$4.1 million for operations, education and outreach, research, and horticultural enhancement. From contributions in support of

enhanced access in the refurbished Rose Garden, and a whimsical new train shed at the Garden Railway, to the seasons-long beauty of *Exuberant Blooms*, our donors enabled us to introduce captivating new garden features that engage, inspire, and delight visitors. Thanks to our donors, visitors can now immerse themselves in multi-sensory experiences that not only celebrate the wonders of the natural world but also offer them the tools they need to learn how they, too, can steward the environment in their own communities, homes, and backyards.

Our donors have also generously supported the Morris's efforts to expand its plant science research program, providing the means by which our researchers can embark on studies that contribute to a global understanding of plant life, especially in the field of rare and endangered plant species. Your unwavering support for the aims of plant science research has fueled our commitment to making a lasting impact in the field.

As the Morris continues to move forward with these efforts, we remain steadfast in our dedication to fostering a deeper connection between people, plants, and place. We are committed to maximizing the impact of every dollar donated, ensuring that your generosity makes a meaningful difference in our programs and initiatives.

Investing in Endowment

The Morris was fully open and able to run all activities in FY23, marking a return to normalcy after external factors limited our operations in FY21 and FY22. With strong earned, gift, and endowment revenue, and cost controls in place, we generated a healthy operating surplus again in FY23.

Endowments make up a large portion of our income pool and revenue from endowments generated over 38 percent of total operating income in FY23. Interest on the endowments provides ongoing support for a large portion of the Morris's operations, with this revenue covering 46.6 percent of total operating expenses in FY23.

While the principal of the endowments may not be touched, gifts to endowment provide a steady funding source for the Morris Arboretum & Gardens and allow us to remain mission-focused regardless of external challenges. The health, depth, and breadth of our endowments is something we rely on and for which we are deeply grateful.

Over the past decade, the Morris has received nearly \$12 million in endowment gifts, with total endowment assets totaling \$81.8 million at the end of the last fiscal year, FY23. As was the case for most organizations with endowment holdings, the market value of the Morris's portfolio experienced a decrease over the past two fiscal years after achieving a stellar high in FY21. Even with this decrease in value, the spendable income from our endowments increased to \$3.9 million by the end of FY23, doubling over the past ten years.

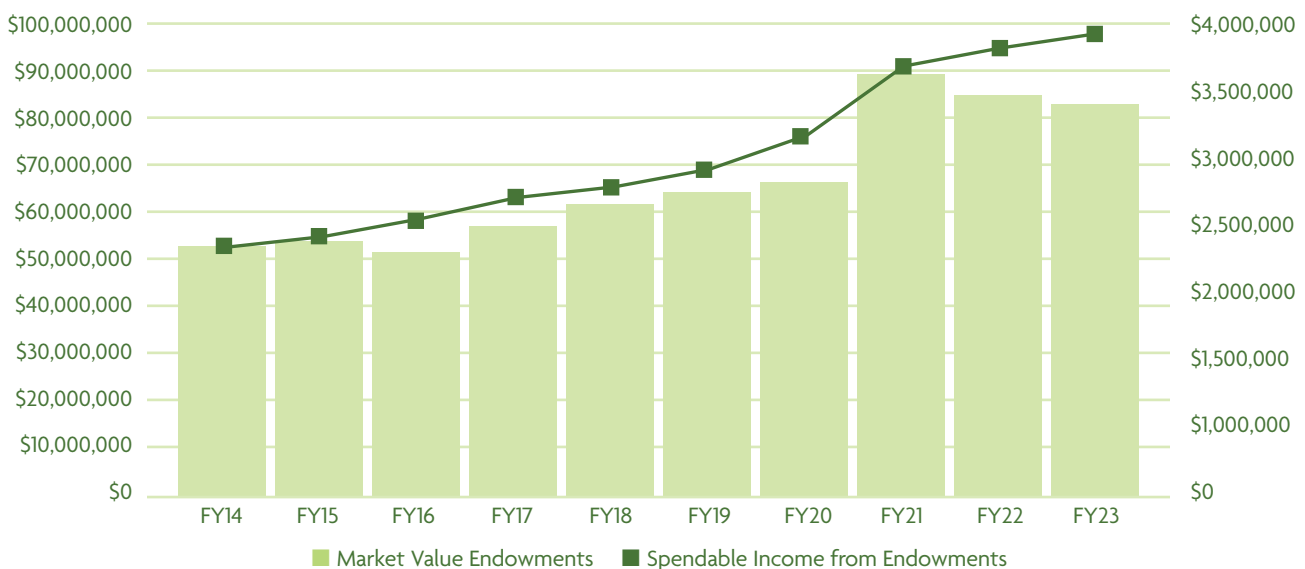

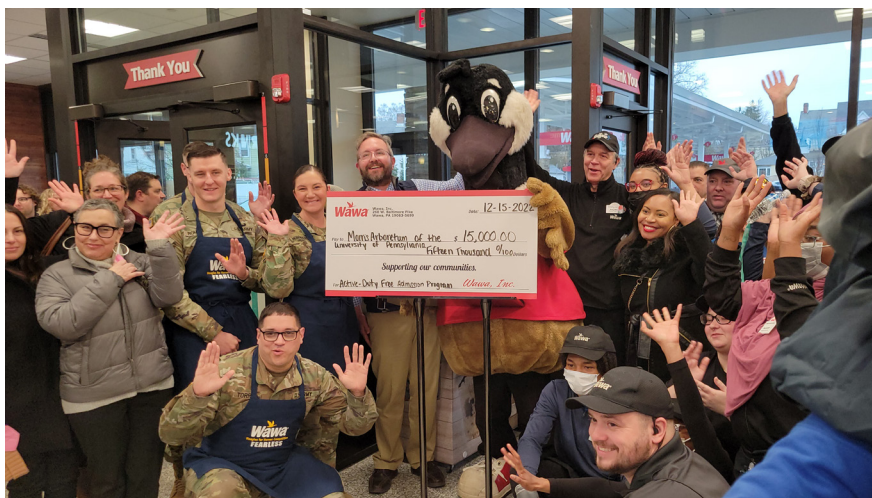

Remembering Paul Meyer

“A great loss to the earth.”

That is how one friend describes the passing of Paul W. Meyer, retired F. Otto Haas executive director of the Morris Arboretum.

Meyer died at his Chestnut Hill home on October 10 of complications from pancreatic cancer. He was 71.

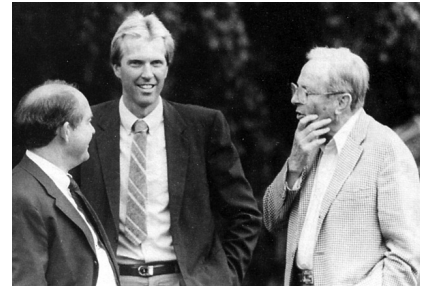
“There was never a more perfect steward of Nature than Paul Meyer,” said Ellen Nalle Hass, former chair of the Advisory Board of Managers. “With (his wife) Debbie by his side, the Morris Arboretum became a world-class organization.”

Paul began his career as the Morris’s director of horticulture and curator, developing a keen understanding of its mission and day-to-day activities while deepening his appreciation of the power of public horticulture. During this time, he oversaw the clearing of overgrown sections of the garden and the renewal of the living collections through expeditions to China and Korea. In 1991 after a nationwide search, Paul was selected to become the Arboretum’s new director. He was chosen for his vision, talent, leadership, and charisma to inspire staff and donors to raise the Morris Arboretum to the level of beauty and inclusion that its founders, John and Lydia Morris, envisioned.

“There is no one who did more to transform the Morris Arboretum into a great institution than Paul,” said Rick Lewandowski, former director of horticulture and curator who worked with Paul. “He had vision and the ‘charming will’ to convince others of his dream to make it so.”

Paul was also passionate about inspiring future generations of public garden leaders. Paul and his wife, Debra Rodgers, personally endowed two funds at the Morris that have been supplemented by contributions from other individuals in his honor: The Paul Meyer and Debra L. Rodgers Study-Travel Endowment and the Paul Meyer and Debra L. Rodgers Historic Preservation Endowment Fund.

“Paul’s love and commitment to the Morris is felt in every acre,” said Bill Cullina, who followed Paul in the role of F. Otto Haas executive director. “We give Paul our deepest thanks for leaving us this beautiful, irreplaceable public garden. As his successor, I am proud and humbled to be able to walk in his footsteps.”
